Our focus continues to be on road safety in and around South Rutland, with routine patrols and speed enforcement where possible.

Operation Enforce continues to address speeding and anti-social driving/riding across Rutland and as a combined team we are working across the county to tackle the problem.

We are very aware that in the summer months some motorists choose not to respect the roads out here, and so you will see an increase in the use of our handheld speed cameras, and static observations utilising our ANPR equipped vehicles.

Residents are always keen to see officers patrolling their villages. Access to your local officers is fundamental to the principles of neighbourhood policing, and we are fortunate enough to have some wonderful community focused locations where we can drop in. But we always want to do better. With that in mind we are looking for locations we can access in order to be closer to our communities, so watch this space!

The benefits are clear. We are closer to hand should any incidents arise, we can provide a clearly visible presence in our villages for longer periods of time, and we can physically be on hand more to deal with any queries or questions that may arise and need a prompter, or face to face response.
