I have just returned from some much needed leave so this week has been catching up with the team and my never ending emails but also meeting with partners to plan for the next quarter.



Melton Scrutiny Committee

On Thursday evening I sat in front of a scrutiny committee to report the work that the police and Melton Borough Council have completed over the last year in tackling crime and disorder in the borough. The scrutiny committee which is formed

predominantly of local councillors responded very positively to what we have achieved as a partnership including a closure order on a property where county lines drug dealing was taking place, It was great to be able to report an overall 8% reduction in all crime and also that Melton bucked the national spike in retail crime with a year on year reduction.

Policing Priorities

Every quarter my local beat teams set the policing priorities for their respective beats, beat officers are now in the process of updating what '**We did**' in the last quarter to address the issues '**you said**' should be a policing priority. Once this is done they will set the new priorities, these are set by surveys completed on Neighbourhood Link along with crime and thematic data.

Some excellent work this week by PC O'Rourke and PC Hill targeting drug supply in Melton Mowbray town centre

Drug dealing is still a beat priority for the Melton Town and Melton South beat.

Reports were received of drug dealing in a property in Melton Mowbray Town Centre and a joint visit was conducted with the Melton Borough Council.

A male linked to this property was stopped and he was detained under section 23 of the misuse of drugs act and a quantity of Class A, B and C drugs were found in his possession.

Male was arrested on suspicion of being concerned in the supply of drugs and his drugs were seized (£)

Further enquiries led to an address on the Melton South Beat being searched where weapons were seized and more drugs.

An investigation is now on going.
